Welcome and Opening Talk: Greener Spaces, Better Places: Placemaking Beyond Brisbane 2032

Irrigation workshop: Understanding what happens when water leaves the pipe

Good irrigation is about more than sprinklers, valves and controllers. What happens after the water leaves the pipe and meets the ground can directly impact soil health, plant performance, water efficiency and the long-term sustainability of landscapes and turf areas.

Developed by Irrigation Australia, this practical and engaging workshop explores how water interacts with soil, plants and the surrounding environment in real landscape settings. Designed for landscape and horticulture professionals, the session focuses on practical irrigation fundamentals, soil-water relationships, irrigation efficiency and smarter decision-making across parks, gardens, sports turf and commercial landscapes.

This high-impact session is designed to deliver practical, field-relevant knowledge that participants can apply immediately in modern landscape and irrigation workplaces.

Full Course Outline: This practical workshop introduces the basics of irrigation performance in landscape settings, with a focus on what happens once water reaches the ground.

Participants will explore how irrigation affects soil health, plant performance, water efficiency and maintenance outcomes. The session will cover common irrigation components, typical field issues such as dry spots, runoff and overspray, and the role of soil type, compaction, slope and application rate in how water moves through the landscape.

The workshop will also look at simple ways to improve irrigation efficiency, including better scheduling, leak reduction, pressure regulation, seasonal adjustments and smarter use of technology such as sensors and controllers.

Key topics include:

- basic irrigation system components
- common landscape irrigation issues
- soil type, infiltration and water movement
- rootzone health and plant response
- improving irrigation efficiency
- environmental impacts of poor irrigation practice
- smarter field observations and decision-making
- emerging irrigation technology

Learning outcome: Participants will gain a practical understanding of how irrigation decisions affect soil, plants, water use and landscape performance.

Education Session:

Future landscapes: Brisbane's living infrastructure legacy and the next six years

As Brisbane prepares for the opportunities and challenges of the next decade, living infrastructure is becoming a critical part of how our cities and communities are planned, designed and delivered. This panel brings together leaders from government, landscape architecture and industry to explore the Brisbane Green Factor, the Green Grid and the broader legacy opportunities of Brisbane 2032. Through a practical and forward-looking discussion, attendees will gain insights into emerging policy directions, the delivery of green infrastructure at scale, and what the landscape sector needs to understand and prepare for over the next six years.

Full overview: Brisbane has ambitious living infrastructure objectives. The Brisbane Green Factor, the Green Grid and the broader legacy opportunities associated with Brisbane 2032 are shaping conversations about how our city and region will grow, adapt and perform in the years ahead.

Wood that endures: everything you have learnt so far is wrong

Over the last few years, a significant body of work has gone into what is shaping up to be the bible of external timber design, Wood That Endures: Designing Natural Area Infrastructure for 30 Years.

The presentation will focus on some of the common misconceptions about external timber, including the most contentious: that weather-exposed timber structures are only suitable for temporary use. It will stress that relying on Australian Standards designed for housing will give a false sense of security that something meaningful has been specified.

Seeing below the surface: smarter, safer technology for everyday landscape practice

Drawing on capabilities in technologies such as Ground Penetrating Radar (GPR), utility locating, GNSS and geospatial mapping, and modern reality capture workflows, underground detection and digital site modelling allow teams to identify buried services, reduce excavation risk, and make better-informed decisions before construction begins.

By combining accurate subsurface investigation with aerial survey and 3D site capture, these tools provide a clearer, data-driven picture of site conditions – helping the landscaping industry improve safety, minimise costly surprises, and integrate smarter planning and design practices into everyday projects
